ABOUT THE ORGANISATION: Eating Matters is a Norfolk charity providing early intervention counselling for people of all ages suffering with mild to moderate eating disorders, in the community. Our primary aim is to intervene early to avoid eating disorder behaviours becoming unmanageable and having a serious impact on a person's physical and mental wellbeing. We have a Centre in Norwich housing counselling rooms and our administrative offices, we also work from satellite locations across the county. We are flexible in how we meet with service users for counselling, preferably face-to-face and since the pandemic, virtually. We offer a maximum of 15 weekly counselling sessions over a 4-6 month period with an ending agreed between the client and the counsellor.

ABOUT THE ROLE: We are looking to grow our team of counsellors working with children and young people. Since the pandemic, numbers of young people referring to our service have significantly increased. Candidates must have a recognised post graduate qualification, or equivalent, in counselling. They must have experience of on-going and time limited counselling and of working with children and young people, particularly those with a mental health problem. The candidate should be accredited, eligible for, or working towards accreditation by the BACP, UKCP or equivalent. We are looking for someone to work a minimum of 10 client hours per week at our centre in Norwich (or at a satellite location in Norfolk, if suitable). The work will be predominately face to face with the ability to adapt to online/phone counselling if needed.
